

INTERNSHIP REPORT

I had the opportunity to do a curricular internship at the Centro Universitario di Studi sui Trasporti Euromediterraneo - Elio Fanara ("CUST") from July 2, 2024, to August 2, 2024, as part of my Master's Degree education at the University of Milan, Law and Sustainable Development LL.M.
